was published to explain why these issues develop and to help property owners understand when routine maintenance or a professional inspection may be appropriate."

According to the information released by the company, many homes built during the 1980s and 1990s may still contain plumbing materials that are approaching the end of their expected service life. The guide explains that galvanized water supply pipes can gradually corrode from the inside, reducing water pressure and eventually affecting water quality. It also notes that older sewer laterals can become vulnerable to tree root intrusion as mature landscaping continues to grow over several decades.

The published guidance also discusses conditions that may affect homes located near lakes or in areas with higher groundwater levels. The resource explains that elevated moisture conditions can place additional stress on underground plumbing systems and may increase the need for regular inspections when drainage or sewer concerns develop. It notes that these conditions can differ significantly from those found in neighborhoods located farther from the lakes.

In addition to older homes, the guide addresses plumbing issues that can develop in newer subdivisions. According to the company, builder-grade plumbing fixtures and water heaters may eventually require repair or replacement as they age through normal use. The resource explains that while newer homes often avoid some infrastructure concerns found in older properties, plumbing components still wear over time and benefit from routine maintenance.

The educational resource also identifies several plumbing issues that can affect homes regardless of their age. Running toilets, worn fixture parts, clogged drains, and water heater sediment buildup are discussed as common household problems that may increase water use or reduce plumbing system performance if left unaddressed. The guide encourages homeowners to monitor changes in water pressure, water discoloration, unusual noises, and recurring drain problems because these signs may indicate larger plumbing concerns.

Another section of the resource explains the difference between plumbing tasks that homeowners can often handle themselves and situations that typically require licensed plumbing work. Simple fixture adjustments and replacing basic toilet components may be manageable for some homeowners. However, work involving water supply lines, sewer repairs, water heaters, gas lines, or permits should generally be performed by qualified professionals. The guide notes that addressing plumbing problems early may help reduce the likelihood of more extensive repairs later.

The company also explains that sewer camera inspections can provide additional information when underground sewer line problems are suspected, particularly in neighborhoods where older piping materials remain in service. The resource states that identifying issues before they become emergencies can help homeowners make informed decisions about future repairs and maintenance.
